#### NEWSLETTER EXCHANGE UPDATE


As mentioned here previously, we are now exchanging newsletters with a number of other family groups.

Among these is the "Van Buskirk family newsletter", a quarterly publication edited by James and Sharon Todd. The purpose of the newsletter is to promote the preservation of all Van Buskirk family information, and to help all Van Buskirk researchers by providing as much data on Van Buskirks as possible, in the form of Bible records, family group sheets, county histories, etc. They provide a central location for distribution of Van Buskirk data and invite all Van Buskirk researchers to register with their "Van Buskirk National Clearinghouse". To anyone interested in the family's history, the interrelationships of the Van Voorhees with other early Dutch and Huguenot families in Nieuw Amsterdam is important. A quick look at the new genealogy shows that in the first two generations of descendants of Steven Coerte, there are marriages with no less than 37 of these families. There are almost no marriages in the same period with apparently non-Dutch families.

## CINNAMON SNAPS circa 1700

Mrs. Howard Pierce of Joshua Tree, CA, sends us this old Dutch recipe from her mother's recipe book. She says that this old Dutch recipe was first introduced to this country when New York was called New Amsterdam. The adventurous cooks among us will have fun with this one!

#### CINNAMON SNAPS

1 cup sugar
1 T. cinnamon
1 cup shortening
1 T. ginger
5 to 6 cups flour
2 t. soda
1 t. salt

2T. warm water

Cream shortening, sugar and molasses. Then add soda dissolved in warm water. Sift 2 cups flour with spices and salt. Add to first mixture. Add enough additional flour to make a stiff dough. Bake 8 to 10 min. in 350° oven.
