# Nieuwsbrief: Publication Times by Marilyn Van Voorhis Voshall, Editor

Over the years I've been thinking that we need to standardize the 2 dates (about 6 months apart) when the 2 issues of the *Nieuwsbrief* are published.

This might not always be possible. Such delays could be caused by illness of the editor and/or other authors who write necessary information. Late pub-

lication could also be caused by "recently" acquired knowledge of major importance.

The advantage of setting these 2 dates means that every author would always know when articles were due. Holidays are not involved, so the Due Dates for Articles will not change.

The 2 Publication Months are APRIL and OCTOBER, which are 6 months apart. This means that the **EDITOR should Receive**:

- 1. ALL ARTICLES for April Publication by MARCH 31st; and
- 2. ALL ARTICLES for October Publication by SEPTEMBER 30th.

#### The Future of Master Genealogist (TMG) Software

Bob Voorhees Greensboro, NC

On July 29, 2014 Bob Velke, owner and sole developer of this software, announced that support for TMG will be discontinued. This decision is apparently made because the market for software of this sophistication is not large enough to support the program.

We have used TMG as our software of choice for over 20 years. Our entire database of close to 100,000 names is a TMG database. (The TMG datato Word). Thank heavens we have the books. We need to thank the leaders of the Van Voorhees Association, especially Manning Voorhees, for making the books happen.

But this is not a time to panic. Experienced software developers know that this sort of thing happens a lot. What usually happens is the software developer community gradually supports the software. There is very sophisticated protocol among private developers for handling situations just like this one. Microsoft will support Windows 8 at least through 2023, so the

current software which we have installed on at least 8 computers should work fine for 9 or 10 years. If bugs creep in they can be fixed by private developers. Very importantly Bob Velke has signaled his support for anyone trying to help his thousands of users. (This would include releasing things like source code to help private developers.) Even though Bob stopped selling the TMG program at the end of Sept, he plans to keep his support staff on the job until the end of 2014.

No comparable Program exists. While some of the advanced features in TMG have comparable functions in some other programs, there is today no program offering many of TMG's best features. Waiting to see what accommodations other developers make or whether any of the several efforts we know about produce a successor program to TMG materialize, seems like a wise choice. Experts are urging TMG users not make any rash choices.

#### Gerret Van Voorhees by Wendy Buscaglia

I became a member of the DAR (Daughters of the American Revolution) in 2012. I initially thought that I would gain membership through my Van Voorhees ancestor but was saddened to discover that he was not in the massive DAR database. This means that even though there may be sufficient evidence of service, that patriot is not recognized by the organization. I gained membership through another ancestor. Once I was a member, I set about to have my fifth great grandfather, Garret Van Voorhees, properly recognized for his service during the Revolution.

The business of adding a patriot to the extensive DAR database is a lengthy and often problematic process. Founded in 1890, the DAR is among the oldest patriotic societies for women in the United States and prides itself on stringent guidelines. While Garret's service is well documented in New York in the Revolution and The Van Voorhees Family in America, he was not recognized by the DAR. This means that no direct descendant of Garret had ever been a member of the organization. The process of proving Garret's service took several months. I was greatly assisted by a volunteer genealogist from my local DAR chapter. The most difficult part of the research involved proving Garret's residency during the Revolution and then proving that he was in fact the same Garret Voorhees listed in service and pension records. There are many Van Voorhees from New York and New Jersey who were patriots. There are also enumerable ways to spell Van Voorhees and Garret! These differences proved tricky to decipher. Another obstacle was that county lines were not static. The Mohawk District, where Garret lived, became the Town of Mohawk in 1772 when Tryon County was split off from Albany County. Today it is part of Montgomery County.

Garret was born April 10, 1761 in Monmouth County, NJ. His parents were Andreas and Ann Voorhees. He was their 5<sup>th</sup> child. Sometime after Garret's birth, the family moved to New York. It can be assumed that the Voorhees family were farmers. It is known that Garrets's father (Andreas b.1729) and grandfather (Hendrick 1696-1766) were farmers as were most of the families in this rural area. In 1782, Garret married Lavinia Francisco in Schagticoke, Rensselaer County, NY. It was during this time that he served with the 14<sup>th</sup> Albany NY Militia as a private under the command of Colonel Peter Yates. Schagticoke's strong Dutch heritage may have help-

ed keep Loyalist activity to a minimum. The Dutch had no great loyalty to the British as they viewed them as past conquerors and economic competitors. According to pension papers, the 14<sup>th</sup> Albany was called out every summer to help patrol the border and work on construction in places like Fort Edward. During my research, I did not find evidence that this militia company saw battle action. Garret received final payment for his services in 1785. It is interesting to note that his wife's three brothers were also part of the 14 Albany Militia.

It can be assumed that after the Revolution, Garret returned to farming and raising his family with Lavinia. They had nine children. Garret died in 1831 in Montgomery, NY. His son was Eleazor (1802-1868). Eleazor's son Phillip Voorhees (1841-1908) was my great-great grandfather. Phillip was the first in his family to leave the New York area in nearly





two hundred and fifty years. He and his wife, Catherine, (above) followed a popular migration route west to Kansas. One of their daughters, Myra Bell married Samuel Britten and they lived in Okla-

homa.

Christine (left), who is my grandmother, in the 1920's moved from Oklahoma to Texas. She and my grandfather raised their ten children in the Longview area. Christine passed away in

2003 at the age of 95.

I am very proud of my ancestor Garret's service during the Revolution, I am thrilled to honor his memory and open up this line for other Voorhees cousins who may want to become members of the Daughters of the American Revolution. I am also indebted to my friend Marion Weiner, the volunteer genealogist who helped me accomplish my goal to have Garret properly recognized.
